

PHOTOGRAPHY & DIGITAL MEDIA

The Photography & Digital Media program offers workshops in image capture, composition, lighting, digital and traditional darkroom processing, historic alternative processes, video, animation, multimedia, physical computing and programming. All workshops are rooted in the same idea: powerful art requires rigorous inquiry into techniques and ideas.

The media labs are color-managed and equipped with Apple G5 computers and NEC monitors, 21 inch iMacs, flatbed and film scanners, digital media software, including the Adobe Creative Suite and Final Cut Pro. Course programming permitting, you may also access strobe lighting equipment, tungsten lighting equipment, seamless backdrops, green screen, audio and video recording equipment, a Howtek D40000 drum scanner, Nikon CoolScan 9000 film scanner, Epson flatbed scanners and Epson large-format printers. Our black & white darkroom facilities include Saunders 4500 diffusion head enlargers with "dial-in" contrast control, Schneider lenses, negative carriers for all standard formats from 35mm to 4"x 5", a compressed air system, water temperature control, UV exposure units and sheet or roll film processing.

PHOTOGRAPHY & DIGITAL MEDIA SKILL LEVELS:

Open to all – Students of any skill and knowledge level

Level I – Students are new to photography and digital media and have no formal training in photography, video, multimedia or animation. Students have basic computer literacy.

Level II – Photography students have a basic understanding of photography principles and technology and are comfortable using an SLR camera in manual mode. Digital Media students have a basic understanding of video, multimedia or animation software. Students have basic computer skills and are comfortable using a Macintosh computer.

Level III – Photography students have some formal training and significant experience making, capturing and digitally processing images. Digital Media students have some formal training in conceptual and technological aspects of video, multimedia or animation and are versed in the appropriate software applications. Students have a portfolio of their artwork.

Level IV – Photography students have advanced skills and knowledge of photography and digital image processing. Digital Media students have advanced skills and knowledge of video, multimedia or animation. Students are self-motivated and have multiple portfolios of their artwork.

SKILL LEVEL: II & III

CONCEPT: Photography is about magic and transformation. If we all use the same tools—cameras, light, computers—why do some photographers produce consistently exceptional work? Transforming what's in front of the camera into a stunning photograph is a form of magic, one that is both learnable and achievable. In this workshop, Jean shares his secrets, helps participants figure out what is missing from their pictures, and shows how to create stronger, more striking images.

MEDIA & TECHNIQUES: Digital cameras, light (natural and artificial), Adobe Photoshop adjustment layers and masks, plus Lightroom and Adobe Camera Raw for raw processing.

ACTIVITIES: We photograph the magnificent Rockies and refine our images in the digital lab. Field trips emphasize pre-visualization and camera skills. Lab time focuses on post-visualization and image processing, with step-by-step demonstrations and hands-on computer practice time. Lessons, critiques and discussions are lively, friendly and encouraging.

FACULTY: Jean Miele's photographs have been exhibited in galleries from New York to Norway. Jean is internationally known as a teacher whose workshops demystify digital and empower students to realize their own photographic vision. He has taught for Adobe Systems, Apple Computer and the International Center for Photography (ICP) in New York.
